

## **REGULATIONS**

1. Use of the Aquatic Complex is available to Association Members and their guests.
  - ~ Members shall register themselves and their guests with Membership Cards before entering.
  - ~ To provide the most hospitable and courteous environment possible, members are encouraged to accompany their guests at all times.
  - ~ Guests must be accompanied by a member who is at least 16 years old.
  - ~ Spectators in street clothes or non-paying guests may view from outside the Complex.
  - ~ Any structured or organized group over 20 people please contact Recreation Director at least 24hrs. in advance to ensure proper staffing.
2. A responsible adult 16 or older shall accompany members 12 and under. A ratio of 1 adult (age 16 or over) per 5 children (age 12 and under) is required.
3. All are expected to maintain proper hygiene, cleanliness, and attire while at the Aquatic Complex. Showering before entering the pool area is expected. Introducing contaminants into the pool area is unacceptable.
4. Please use diapers specifically designed for swimming. Proper changing stations are available in the locker rooms.
5. All patrons are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that does not interfere with other patrons' right to safely enjoy their experience. Indecent or profane language, rough play and running are not tolerated. No person under the influence of drugs or alcohol is welcome.
6. For the safety of all swimmers and themselves, anyone showing evidence of contagious disease, abrasions that have not healed, or bandages is asked to refrain from using the Aquatic Complex.
7. Diving is permitted in the deep end of the outdoor pool only.
8. Food, beverages, coolers and any containers thereof must remain in the designated eating areas outside the Aquatic Complex.
9. Inflatable toys, floatation devices, and balls are prohibited. Coast Guard approved lifejackets are permitted. Floating swimsuits and other safety attire may be permissible upon inspection and approval by the Manager on Duty. Lifejackets and such equipment may be utilized in the deep end as an extra precaution, but only by those who are capable of swimming without them. Children must be closely supervised by an adult while wearing such equipment.
10. Lake Carroll is not responsible for lost or stolen property.
